

Instructions to download and Install Gadwin Print Screen.

1:

- Open your browser, (Explorer or Firefox)
- In the address field type www.gadwin.com/printscreens/



This page should come up.



2: Scroll down the page until you see

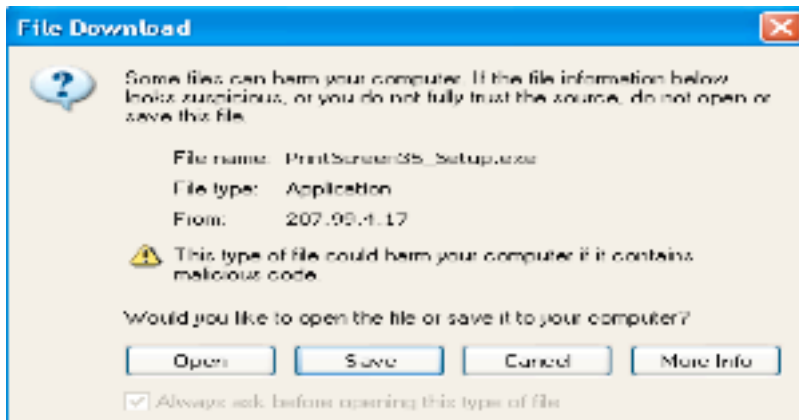
["Download freeware Gadwin PrintScreen now."](#) and left-click to start download.

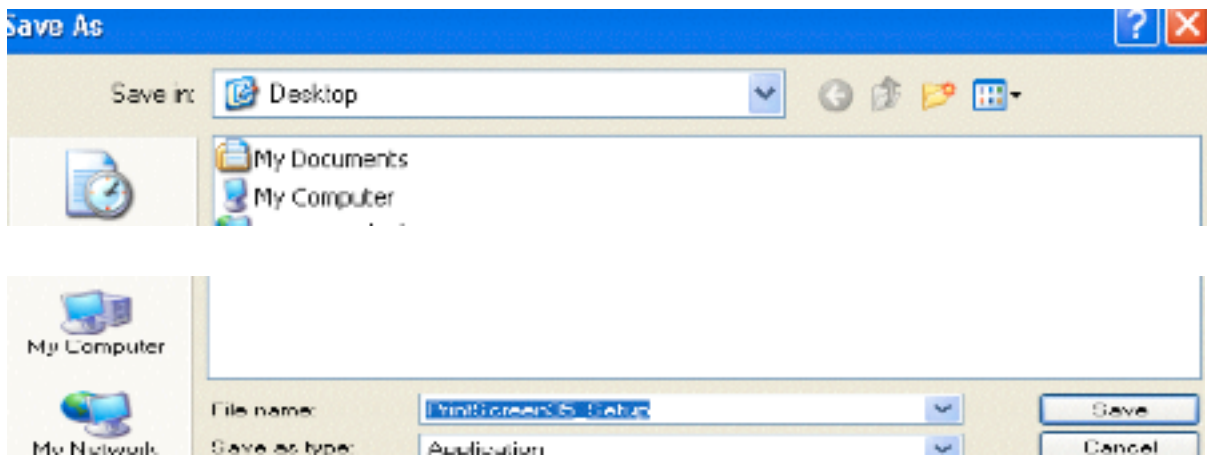

3: Click *Save* on this screen. (Or click "open" . Sometimes the window will only give you a choice of "save" or "run" then click "run"

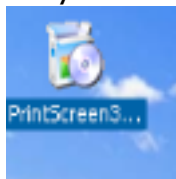


4: If you clicked *save*, the computer is ready to download a program and place it in a folder or on your desktop. On the next screen, be sure it says "save file to desktop" and click "save".



5: An icon may appear on your desk top. (After the program has been downloaded and installed, this icon can be deleted.)

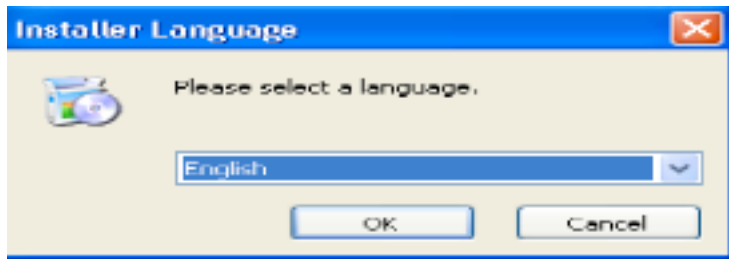
Note: the steps may vary slightly depending on your Windows version. If you clicked "open" or "run" Windows will likely start the installation automatically. If the installation did not start automatically, look for



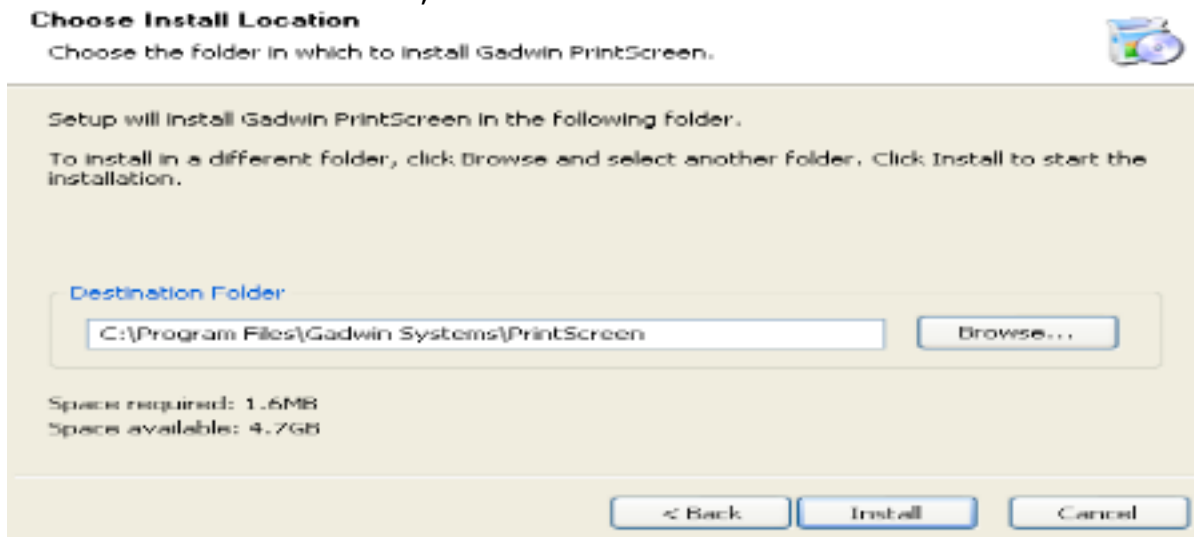
this icon

and click on it to start installing the program.

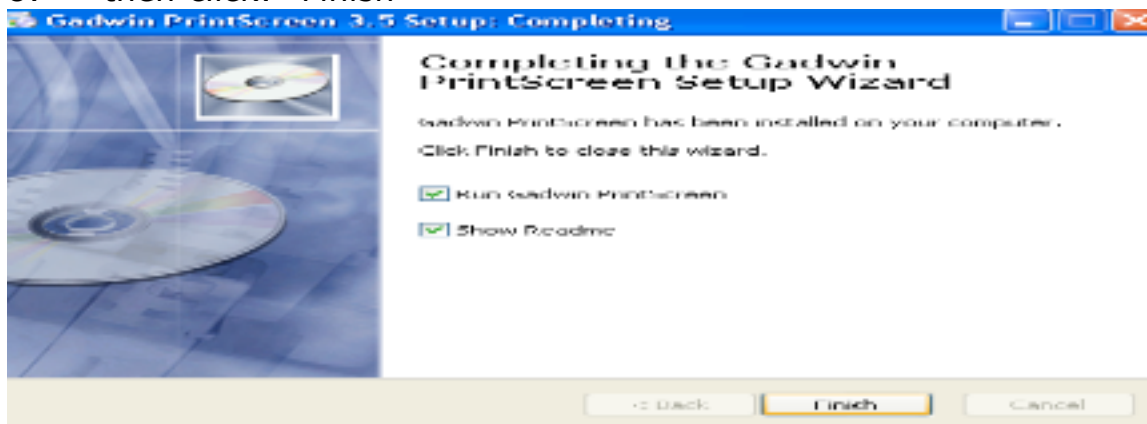
6: In the next screen select the language of your choice. [If you want help from us, please choose English. :-)] and click "OK"



7" On the next screen, click "install"



8: then click: "Finish"



9: An icon for Gadwin Print Screen is installed in the task bar system

tray, bottom right corner.



10: You can now delete the installation icon from the desk top. (Drag it to the garbage bin.)

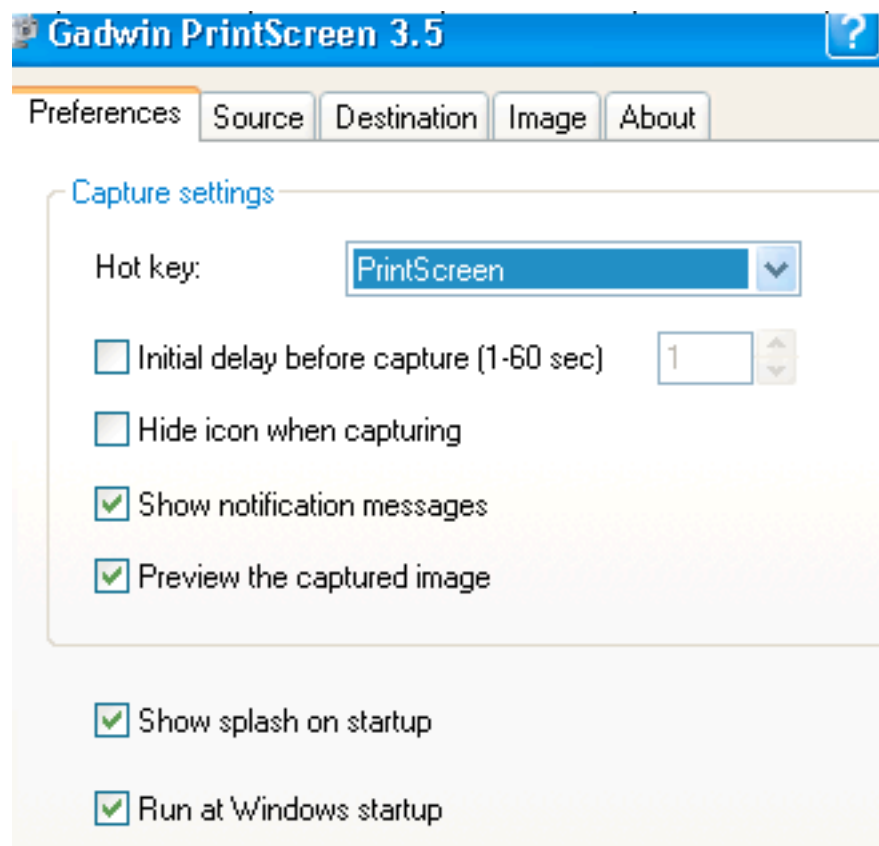
Set up Instructions:

1: Right-click on the Printscreen icon to open the menu and select "set up".

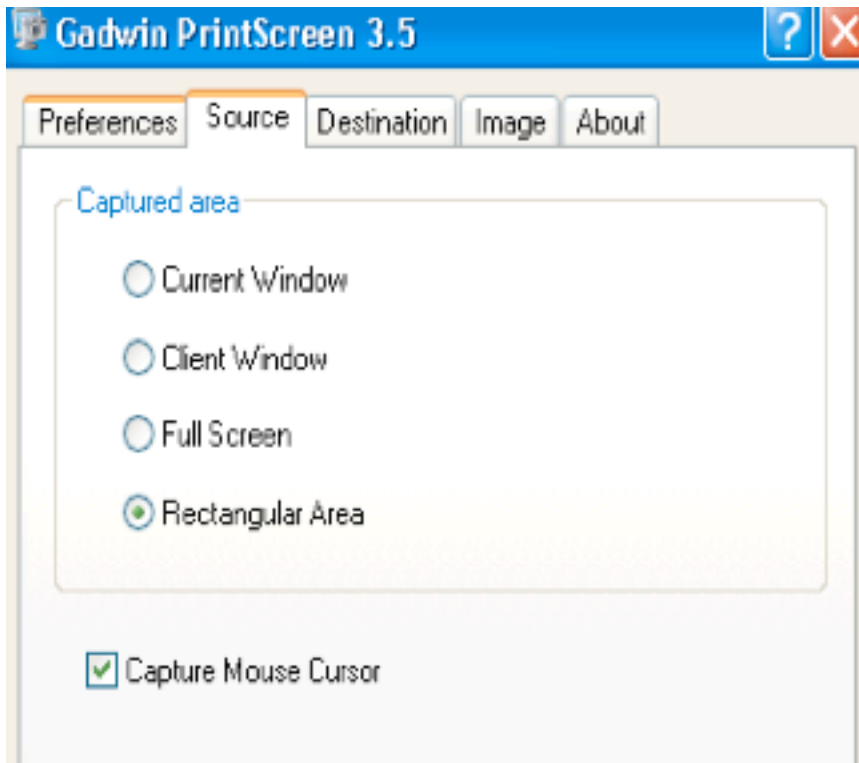
2: The following screens show pictures of the recommended settings.

2.1: Click on "Preferences" on the pane and check the settings.

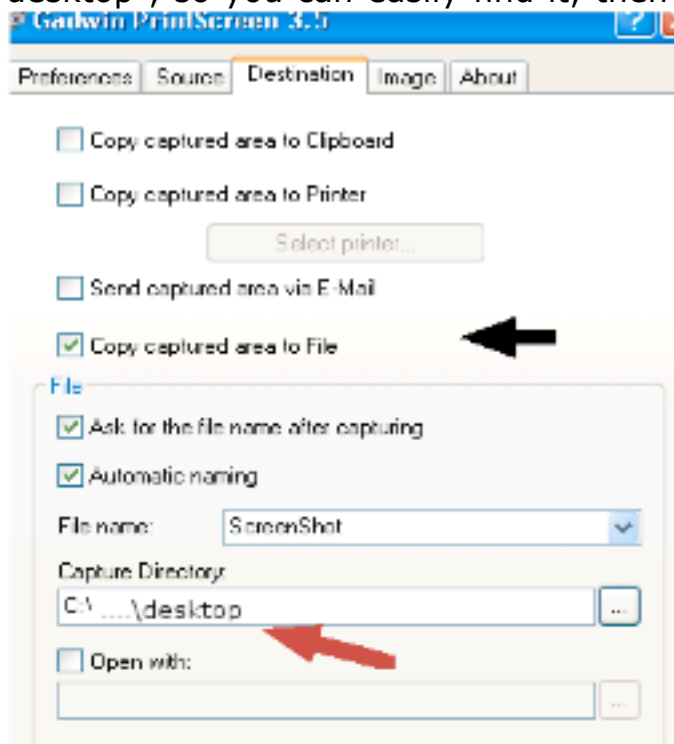
By default, PrintScreen will start up when you press the "print screen" key on your keyboard.



2.2: Now click on "Source". Set the Radio button to "Rectangular Area". This way you can take a screen shot of a portion of the screen, by dragging your mouse across the area.



2.3: In the "Destination" pane, select "copy area to a file on the desktop", so you can easily find it, then move it to where you want later.



3. You are now ready to take snapshots of your desktop, or any portion.

Try it. Decide what area of the screen you want to take a snapshot of.

For instance, you could be in the "my pictures" folder, looking at a photograph. Say that you want to take a snapshot of one portion of that photo.

1. Make sure the pointer is not in the picture area.
2. Click the "printscreen" key on your keyboard.
3. You will now see a second pointer, but this one is different from the regular one. It will move instead of the regular mouse pointer.
4. While holding down the mouse, slide it across the area you want to take a picture of. Best is to start in one corner and work diagonally across. Notice the little window off to the side showing what you are copying?
5. When done, let go. A new window should open up showing you the choices of where to save the file to. At set up, if you followed the instructions above, you have it set to save the file to your desktop. You could change it to go to the "my pictures folder" here. Or move the file later. You can also choose to save it directly to an email.
6. Remember to **name** the file.
